Original printed paper over boards, spines quite worn and chipped. Vol.2 Pt.1 boards and first signature detached. Other parts with spines nearly perished, hinges weak and contents held by cords, a few leaves loose. Foxing to most plates and to some text leaves, some offsetting of text to plates. Untrimmed.

Originally intended to contain 60 hand-colored plates, Bigelow sought a method of plate production that would be faster and less laborious than hand-coloring. He settled on a color-printing process in which color was applied directly to etched stone plates, creating one of the earliest U. S. publications with color-printed plates. As Bennett states, "This is one of the very earliest American color plate books and held in universal esteem." Richard Wolfe's monograph on the book, Jacob Bigelow's American Medical Botany, notes that no more than 200 of the entire run of 1,000 copies contained the hand-colored plates, as are found in this set.

This copy has been nicely re-backed in leather with the original spine including its red morocco lettering piece laid down. Original marbled endpapers; small ink stamp noting "Barnicott, Binder, Taunton" on verso of front free endpaper. Early ownership signature of "W. Hockin, Taunton" on title. Binding somewhat scuffed, mainly at corners. Some soiling on text leaves; one leaf with small piece of corner missing; some offsetting on plates with foxing in margins.

William Forsyth (1737-1804) was employed at the Apothecaries' Garden at Chelsea where he studied under Philip Miller. He then became Gardener to the King at Kensington and St. James's from 1784 until his death in 1804. When he took his post at Kensington he found that the trees were in such a sad state that he set about rejuvenating them and attending to tree wounds with a curative plaster he developed. He had much success with this, and this book which describes his approach was republished both in England and in America where William Cobbett adapted it for American conditions. Overall a VG copy. American editions of this title are more common than this first quarto edition.

The National Rose Society was established in 1876 to promote and improve the art of growing roses; it published the first Annual in 1907. In 1965 it became the Royal National Rose Society and it continued publishing the Annual until 1984. Beginning in 1985 a quarterly publication called The Rose succeeded the Annual. The volumes in the present run contain articles on various aspects of rose growing primarily in England but also abroad and in America. There are reviews of new rose introductions, flower shows and of books. Familiar and knowledgeable authors include H. Edlund, A. J. Macself, Roy Hay, Graham S. Thomas, etc. The bulk of the earlier volumes were edited by Bertram Park and the later by Leonard Hollis. Some volumes with faded spines. A run in very good condition charting the rise of rose interest in the post-war years. Runs of print periodicals become more scarce as migration to electronic publications advances.

Otto E. Plath (1885-1940), father of the noted poet Sylvia Plath, was a professor of biology and German at Boston University when he wrote this in 1934. He specialized in entomology and was an avid beekeeper, interests that led him to write this book on the natural history and habits of bumblebees. The book also contains a detailed appendix on the more important North American species plus an 18pp. bibliography.

Sylvia Plath was just two years old when her father published this work, his first and only book, and she was just eight years old when he died. Interestingly, she uses bee imagery in several of her poems as a metaphor for her complex relationship with her father. On the front free endpaper is a signed inscription by Otto Plath to Professor Earle A. Brooks (1871-1952), a Presbyterian minister and science professor in Boston. And laid in is a signed, typewritten note to Professor Brooks written on Otto Plath's Boston University stationary thanking him for his review of Bumblebees for Bostonia. Small stain on fly. This constitutes a corrected reprint of the Stokes NY 1907 edition, with a two-item errata printed on the verso of the Dedication page. It contains detailed tables arranged by month and within month by color. Tables give color, common and botanical names, description, height, light requirements and bloom time for each plant.
