NOTABLE RECENT ACQUISITIONS

1. **Gerarde, John** - *THE HERBALL or Generall Historie of Plantes*. Gathered by John Gerarde of London, Master in Chirurgerie. Very Much Enlarged and Amended by Thomas Johnson, Citizen and Apothecary of London. Approximately 2,800 woodcut illustrations. pp.(19),1630,(24). Quarto (13" x 8 3/8"). Henrey #156; Hunt #230; Stafleu #1993. London 1636.

Bound in later 19th-century half morocco with six raised bands by C. & E. Brown, Bayswater, London. Binding scuffed, joints and edges worn, engraved title trimmed to image and mounted with slight loss at top, dedication leaf re-hinged, some light marginal soiling, some leaves cropped close at top with partial loss of top rule, stain in outer corner of a few rear leaves, 1/4" hole in p.557/558 affecting a few words, 2" tear in p.101/102 and 7A1, 1" tear in margin of p.625/626 & p.851/852, crudely stitched tear in 7A1. Small 18th-century booklabel of J. L. Harrison of Penrith on title.

John Gerard (1545-1612), an English barber/surgeon and botanist, first published his Herbal in 1597. It was based on Rembert Dodoens' Stirpium Historiae Pemptades Sex (1583) and utilized the plant classification system of Mattias de l'Obel. The second edition, published in 1633, was thoroughly revised by Thomas Johnson, an apothecary and botanist, who corrected the numerous errors found in the first edition. Johnson devised a method for noting in the text the degree to which he edited or added to Gerard's descriptions, thus enabling the reader to distinguish between the two authors. This 1636 "edition" is actually a re-issue of the 1633 edition but with a new date on the title page. Most of the woodcuts for the first edition of Gerard's Herbal (1597) were from the blocks used to illustrate Tabernaemontanus' Eicones (1590); this second edition was enhanced by the use instead of woodblocks from the well-known Antwerp publisher, Plantin. Of note is the fact that Gerard's Herbal was the first work in which an illustration of the humble but proud potato appears. Popular throughout the 17th and 18th centuries, the work contains descriptions, habitat, medicinal and other uses for about 2,850 plants. A number of pages are misnumbered [details and complete collation available on request]. As usual, this copy lacks one preliminary and one rear leaf (P1 and 7B6), both of which are blanks - see Hunt #230. The verso of the last leaf contains advertisement for Johnson's second edition of Gerard. A good complete copy of this landmark herbal. \$3,750.00

2. **Ohba, Hideaki** - *DRAWINGS OF ALIEN PLANTS OF JAPAN: A COLLECTION*. 200 full-page color botanical plates by 106 members of the Japanese Association of Botanical Illustration followed by a smaller b&w copy of the same plates with descriptive text in Japanese and English. pp.xix,(1),330,(1). 4to. (Kanagawa, Japan 2009). We are the U.S. distributors for this book.

This work on the naturalized plants of Japan is the second publication issued by the Japanese Association of Botanical Illustration, the first being Endangered Plants of Japan (2004). The plates, executed during a three year period, are by a variety of botanical artists and so represent a range of styles and approaches to illustrating plants. All include an illustration of the full plant and most also include botanical details; degree of magnification is also noted. The botanical text by Hideaki Ohba which accompanies the plates notes the kind of plant illustrated, its habitat, distribution, flowering period and date of introduction where known. A lovely work. 3. **Randolph, Cornelia J. - *THE PARLOR GARDENER: A Treatise on the House Culture of Ornamental Plants. Translated from the French and Adapted to American Use.*** 11 numbered b&w plates showing etageres, mantel-piece gardens, hanging flower vases, etc. 158pp. 16mo. (5.25" x 3.5"). Original brown cloth with gilt-stamped title panel and spine. Boston (1861).

Cloth faded, spine ends bumped, name of "G. H. Van Wagerren (?) Dec. 23rd, 1861" on fly, numerous pencil marks in text, marginal tear in p.137/138. Frontispiece with mild foxing (tissue guard present); other plates in very good condition.

The author, Thomas Jefferson's granddaughter, divides the work into two parts: "the garden in the apartment" and "the garden at the window." The engraved plates show charming examples of the Victorian use of house plants. Overall G+ condition. \$225.00

Boards spotted and soiled. Early rebacking in green muslin, front paste-down endpaper coming up, corner of front free endpaper cut out (1" tall by 2.75" wide), occasional foxing and browning. Former ownership notations: "J. Porter's property, 1818" and "Clara Hudson, 1821" on the front free endpaper. Though worn, the binding is sound.

Louis-Claude Richard (1754-1821) was a French botanist and plant hunter who traveled to the Caribbean and South America and then became a professor of botany at the Ecole de Medecine in Paris, where he taught from 1795 to his death in 1821. His primary work was this dictionary, originally published in French in 1798. The copy offered here is the first edition (of four) of the English translation done by Amos Eaton. It contains hundreds of definitions and was used by botanists following the Linnean system of nomenclature. This was the first separately issued botanical dictionary published in the United States. \$625.00

Blith was the author of two books: *The English Improver (1649)* and the title offered here, which is essentially an expanded edition of the former and which was first published in 1652. This particular 1653 impression of the book adds sections on clover, ploughs, dye plants, hops, hemp, the care of orchards, etc. The author was an early advocate of improving crops using field drainage. \$750.00

His considerable skill is evident in his depictions of these native American wildflowers. He also did the plates for Michaux's Histoire des Chenes de l'Amerique (1801). The Flora Boreali-Americana was the first published flora of North America. It was published in 1803 in two issues: a quarto one printed on wove paper and this octavo issue printed on laid paper; both have identical type setting. It was reprinted in 1820.
